National Competition Criteria

Range Requirements:

1. Small Bore and High Power
2. At least 3 sets (30 each of chickens, pigs, turkeys and rams) of small bore (120) and 3 half sets (15 each of chickens, pigs, turkeys and rams) of High power (60)
3. Covered firing point.

Match staff:

1. Match director
2. Two statisticians
3. Range officer plus relief RO
4. Target setters: Chief setter plus at least 4 setters.
5. Jury (to be announced and posted prior to the match commencing)

Program:

Tournament is to be run on the NRA Rifle Silhouette Rules, but sanctioned by Silhouette Rifle Association of Canada. The match program should be sent out well ahead of date of the nationals. (Suggest January) Also it is advised to state a late entry fee date to make sure entries are received in sufficient time to order appropriate awards.

Prizes:

There are 4 annual Canadian Resident Championship aggregate trophies, one for each discipline. These must be present at prize presentation.

Aggregate awards are also given for top Open, Lady, and Senior (60+ yrs) and junior (under 21 yrs), if sufficient entries are received (more than 1). High Animal awards are given for each rifle class. Example, High Chickens, etc.

Awards are presented to Match winners and placings in each classification, as well as aggregate prizes. Requirements for awards are: one prize for every 3 competitors in each class, up to 4th place, then one for every 5 competitors.

Match winners do not qualify for class awards

Equipment certification:

All rifles must be checked to see that they meet the rules, and marked with sticker to show certification. A 30" length of 4" PVC pipe shall be used to check the competitor's vests. At the discretion of the Match Director, vests may be checked during the match at any time.

Funding:

A grant in the amount of \$1500 from SRAC is available to clubs hosting the national silhouette matches. To qualify for grant, club must, within 30 days from close of competition: (a) have results sent out to participants and secretary treasurer of SRAC and (b) request the grant from secretary treasurer.
